**National Pastor and Church Planting Spotlight**

**Dear Friend of Team Ghana:**

This is our second month using this new format to provide for you more information about the men we have sent out to pastor and their ministries. Instead of giving four or five testimonies from different pastors in a given month, we are planning to send more in-depth information about one pastor per month. Our focus this month is on . . .

**Pastor Rexford Aning – Fundamental Baptist Church of Sunyani**

**Background:** Before he was saved, **Pastor Rexford Aning** was attending our church. He had been invited by Missionary Mike Williams, who was the pastor of our church at the time. In October 2008, fellow student, Seth Appah, shared the Gospel with Rexford, and he trusted Christ as his Saviour. He heard about our Bible college, Hyles-Anderson College of West Africa, through Missionary Mike Williams. Bro. Rexford enrolled in October 2008 and graduated with his bachelor’s degree in June 2012. In February 2017, he graduated with his master’s degree.

**Family:** In March 2012, he married Deborah, and they currently have five boys—Daniel, David, Samuel, James, and Michael. Michael was just born this past November. His wife plays the piano for their church, and they even have an orchestra! In addition to other church members, Daniel plays the trumpet, and David plays the saxophone. Samuel plays a recorder, and James is learning to play the piano!



**Ministry:** In October 2012, he started **Fundamental Baptist Church of Sunyani**. God has blessed this church (*on left*) with their own church building and a parsonage for the Aning family. They have a Christian school (*middle*) with 153 students. Pastor Rexford is a soul winner and leads his church people to win souls; pictured on the right below is a Bible Club conducted by Bro. Stephen (in white), who is blind but still a very active soul winner. Pastor Rexford often has opportunities to preach in local schools and on the radio.



**Prayer Requests:** A contractor was working on a bridge near their property and did not properly divert the water. So on Wednesday evening, March 4, when it rained hard and long, their parsonage was flooded. The Anings lost furniture and much clothing. They also lost many schoolbooks.
