We are thankful for those of you who are with us through your prayers, communications, and support.

We have shared in the past there was a report on five who had been bit by a rabid dog. Saturday we had the funds to give for the second shot, but being the weekend we were unable to contact the people that asked for help in the first place. We checked the paperwork and found the phone number was one digit short so we went to the hospital in the area that we understood knew of the case. After several people we were finally led to someone who was supposed to help us. Need less to say she refused to call anyone, eventually realizing we were getting no where we left. We eventually got the case confirmed from the local veterinarian. There are five doses. We paid for the first, The assembly in Lusaka paid for the second dose and the last three doses still need to be funded last we heard. The meds were found for \$109.10 total for all the victims. Please pray and consider donating for the meds of these rabies victims, we do not currently have the funds and the assembly in the Lusaka just finished a Bible conference which was a big undertaking for them.

We have been told to go forward by Social Welfare in the Application process for Samuel to go to Amano. We submitted the application and got the founder of the Amano School Mr. G ____, to be one of our two References. He said he would speak on our behalf. He also back in 2014 enabled us to be in Zambia under Christian Mission In Many Lands. Regarding our and Samuel's future we are laying everything before our Lord and you that you can know our present circumstances. In the will of the Lord we may have to take a quick journey for the interview for Samuel's school.

We were slowed in the Adoption process and pray for the Lord's mind, purpose, and will to be accomplished that we may continue to be the light of of Jesus Christ in a dark world. Whatever corner we as Christians find ourselves in, we are to surrender our lives and shine in and through the darkness. Considering the Book of Jude, that we can pull some out of the fire before that final day where we will see the Saviour face to face. One will either hear, "Well done, thou good and faithful servant." Or "Depart from me into everlasting fire prepared for the devil and his angels." As we currently experience our lives in a temporal body currently, to know there is an eternity just beyond our last mortal breath. As God's Word says, Prepare to meet thy God. We have appreciated the small amount of fellowship we have had with Lusaka Gospel Hall. Lusaka Gospel Hall had A Bible Conference over the Zambia Holdidy Weekend. This past Monday was Hero's Day, Tuesday was Unity Day. We joined the Conference through Zoom and heard a speaker from the UK-Scotland. Collin Hutchinson spoke on Christ as the Head of His body the Church.

He also spoke on The Judgment Seat of Christ and the important role of mother's, raising one's children as one of the many thoughts.

We have received a letter to report to Amano Christian School (CMML) in Northwestern Zambia. We have Interviews on August 10th. We are thankful for the Lord's prompting of our Brethren, our road trip has been covered. As the Lord leads and guides. The School is more expensive yet they have many more safeguards including a Child Protection Officer who is on campus. The opportunities to minister to the community are built in, more accountability, and greater opportunities to explore Zambia as a whole through field trips, etc... We have been directed by Social Welfare to enter

Samuel in School and we are prayerful that Lord willing we may move closer and possibly be able to assist at the school.

We have fully had the five rabies cases confirmed by going to Department of Health Office Officer. Each patient will need three more doses. Pray that they can be managed.

The above verse was in a message from a Brother James Knox who spoke carefully expressing how we are not to focus on our separation from things such as habits, listed activities, perceived sins, that are not listed in the bible.
